Carpanta strip in the magazine Pulgarcito, no. 1377, 1958

Description: Carpanta is a child of Spanish post-war hunger. It was created by the cartoonist José Escobar in 1947 for the magazine Pulgarcito and in many of his strips, we find poor Carpanta drawn by white waves that represent the smell of food and create a shared space: literally enveloping Carpanta, directing him and setting him in motion. Carpanta strip (“I smell roast chicken! I'm going to get up at once. / My nose indicates that the chicken's position is to the left!”), drawn by José Escobar, and published in the magazine Pulgarcito (Magazine for young people), no. 1377, 1958.
